Every year during Great Lent our church school children are asked to collect coins and place them in an offering box to benefit OCMC. The following article highlights one of the many ways these funds are used to help those mission parishes in other countries. Saints Peter and Paul Orthodox Christian Church: Rockaway, New Jersey March 5

On Wednesday evening a few from our community took part in the beautiful Pre-Sanctified Liturgy at Saint John the Baptist Church in Rahway. It was a powerful Lenten experience for all those present.

It was made especially beautiful through the prayerful participation of His Grace, Bishop NEOFYTOS of Nieri and Mount Kenya (pictured above). He has been a bishop of the Orthodox Church in Kenya for four years now, and he spoke at the conclusion of the Liturgy about how when he started his ministry as bishop in Kenya, he started with nothing. Nowhere to live, no office, no cathedral, no nothing.

Upon his assignment to his newly-formed Diocese he went to the Patriarch of Alexandria having prayed that the Patriarch would offer him financial assistance with this undertaking. He laughed in saying that he was disappointed when the Patriarch said instead that his work was done, and that Jesus Christ would provide what was necessary.

Bishop Neofytos' insisted his biggest concern was that his priests would have difficulty getting from their homes to the Churches for the Sunday Divine Liturgy because many lived great distances from their Church and had no form of transportation.

In 2016, he came to the United States to visit with a priest in Saint Louis, Missouri with whom he had gone to Holy Cross Seminary in Boston alongside our own Bishop Gregory. He asked the priest if it would be possible to try to raise money in order to purchase motorcycles for his clergy to travel around.

Since that time nearly every priest in his diocese has had a motorcycle purchased for their use, and the use of the greater community. Only twenty more are needed.

To put this into perspective for us: our Dean, Father Andrew Fetchina asked His Grace, how much a motorcycle costs in Africa. I was thinking \$10,000 maybe.

The Bishop said: \$1,300. That's it.

The funds our parishioners are collecting in the coin boxes which we distributed at the start of Great Lent (of which more are still available) can be used for the express purpose of the purchase of a motorcycle (or motorcycles) for the priests of his Diocese.

The bishop's grin grew largest (and he smiled a great deal) when he spoke of how in one village the motorcycle was the only mode of transportation. A woman was nearing the end of her pregnancy and was having a great deal of trouble. She needed to get to the distant hospital and fast. They thought about the fact that the Orthodox Priest in the village was the only one with a vehicle, went to him, and he took her to the hospital.

The motorcycles not only assist with the priests getting to their Churches but for the benefit and welfare of the entire community.

I encourage you to give generously from your heart, and maybe, to go beyond coins, into the green bills, and many colored checks in order to support the work of Bishop Neofytos and his clergy, and faithful in Kenya.
